4. Legal basis, eligibility and rules of origin

The legal basis of this procedure is:

- Financing Agreement between the European Union and the Arab Republic of Egypt for financing the action "Enhancing the Response to Migration Challenges in Egypt (ERMCE)" No: T05-EUTF-NOA-EG-01:
- European Union Contribution Agreement providing a financial contribution to the implementation of the action "Multi-Educational Programme for Employment Promotion In Migration-Affected Areas" T05-EUTF-NOA-EG-01-06 (T05.255);
- Regulation (EU) No 236/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 11 March 2014 laying down common rules and procedures for the implementation of the Union's instruments for financing external action, and
- Regulation (EU) No 232/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 11 March 2014 establishing a European Neighbourhood Instrument. See Annex A2 of the practical guide.

Participation is open to all natural persons who are nationals of and legal persons (participating either individually or in a grouping – consortium – of tenderers) which are effectively established in a Member State of the European Union or in an eligible country or territory as defined under article 8 of Regulation (EU) No 236/2014 establishing common rules and procedures for the implementation of the Union's instruments for external action (CIR) for the applicable instrument under which the contract is financed.

Participation is also open to international organisations.

All supplies under this contract must originate in one or more of these countries.

5. Candidature

All eligible natural and legal persons (as per item 4 above) or groupings of such persons (consortia) may participate or tender.

A consortium may be a permanent, legally established grouping or a grouping which has been constituted informally for a specific procurement procedure. All partners of a consortium (i.e., the leader and all other partners) are jointly and severally liable to the contracting authority.

The tender of an ineligible natural or legal person will result in the automatic exclusion of that person. In particular, if that ineligible person belongs to a consortium, the whole consortium will be excluded.

6. Number of requests to participate or tenders

No more than one tender can be submitted by a natural or legal person whatever the form of participation (as an individual legal entity or as leader or partner of a consortium submitting a request to participate or tender). In the event that a natural or legal person submits more than one request to participate or tender, all requests to participate or tenders in which that person has participated will be excluded.

In case of lots, the tenderers may submit only tender per lot. Contracts will be awarded lot by lot and each lot will form a separate contract.

7. Period of implementation of tasks

150 days from contract signature by both parties subject to extension until the provisional acceptance.

8. Language of the procedure

All written communications for this tender procedure and contract must be in English.

9. Additional information

Financial data to be provided by the candidate in the request to participate form or in the tender submission form must be expressed in EUR. If applicable, where a candidate refers to amounts originally expressed in a different currency, the conversion to EUR shall be made in accordance with the InforEuro exchange rate of **November**, 2023, which can be found at the following address: http://ec.europa.eu/budget/graphs/inforeuro.html.

SELECTION CRITERIA

10. Selection criteria

Capacity-providing entities

An economic operator (i.e. candidate or tenderer) may, where appropriate and for a particular contract, rely on the capacities of other entities, regardless of the legal nature of the links which it has with them. If the economic operator relies on other entities, it must in that case prove to the contracting authority that it will have at its disposal the resources necessary for the performance of the contract by producing a commitment by those entities to place those resources at its disposal. Such entities, for instance the parent company of the economic operator, must respect the same rules of eligibility and notably that of nationality as the economic operator relying on them and must comply with the selection criteria for which the economic operator relies on them. **Furthermore, the data for this third entity for the relevant selection criterion should be included in a separate document**. Proof of the capacity will also have to be provided when requested by the contracting authority.

With regard to technical and professional criteria, an economic operator may only rely on the capacities of other entities where the latter will perform the tasks for which these capacities are required.

With regard to economic and financial criteria, the entities upon whose capacity the economic operator relies, become jointly and severally liable for the performance of the contract.

The selection criteria for each tenderer are as follows:

- 1) Economic and financial capacity (based on item 3 of tender form for supply contracts). In case of candidate being a public body, equivalent information should be provided. The reference period which will be taken into account will be the last three years for which accounts have been closed.
 - the average annual turnover of the tenderer for the past 3 financial years (2020, 2021 and 2022) for which accounts have been closed must exceed the value of the submitted tender. If tendering for more than one lot, the tenderer must satisfy this criterion cumulatively; and
 - Current ratio (current assets/current liabilities) in the last year for which accounts have been closed must be at least 1. In case of a consortium, this criterion must be fulfilled by each member.
 - **2) Professional capacity** (based on items 4 and 5 of the tender form for supply contracts). The reference period which will be taken into account will be the last three years (2020, 2021 and 2022) preceding the submission deadline.
 - Number of staff currently are working for the tenderer in a field related to this tender should be 8 or more. If tendering for more than one lot this criterion stays unchanged.
- 3) <u>Technical capacity</u> (based on items 5 and 6 of the tender form for supply contracts). The reference period which will be taken into account will be the five years (2018, 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022) from submission deadline.
 - The tenderer has delivered supplies under two contracts with a total cumulated budget at least equal to the value of the submitted tender. The contracts are for items similar to those included in this tender. If the tenderer applies for more than one lot, the value of the submitted tender is calculated as a sum of the value of all the lots included in the submitted tender.

The contracts were implemented at any time during the last five years prior to the submission deadline.

This means that the contract the candidate refers to could have been started at any time during the indicated period but it does not necessarily have to be completed during that period, nor implemented during the entire period. Candidates are allowed to refer either to projects completed within the reference period (although started earlier) or to projects not yet completed. Only the portion satisfactorily completed during the reference period will be taken into consideration. This portion will have to be supported by documentary evidence (statement or certificate from the entity which awarded the contract, proof of payment) also detailing its value. If a candidate has implemented the project in a consortium, the percentage that the candidate has successfully completed must be clear from the documentary evidence, together with a description of the nature of the services provided/supplies delivered if the selection criteria relating to the pertinence of the experience have been used.
